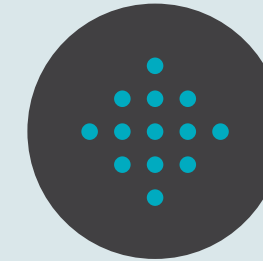
NBSS
